





If you find that in the INDEX first, it will take you less time to find JOHN. Once you have the right book, finding the chapter and verse is quite easy.







THE EMPTY TOMB

The city of Jerusalem was packed with people. Jews from near and far were arriving for a week-long Passover festival. Just when it seemed that the narrow streets could hold no more, fresh batches of Jewish pilgrims surged in. The city was buzzing with the latest story about Jesus. He had actually brought back to life a man who had been dead and buried for four days! As soon as news arrived that Jesus was on His way, an excited crowd set off to meet Him. Meanwhile, Jesus had sent his disciples to fetch him a young donkey. And with his disciples' coats as a saddle, He was beginning the ride into Jerusalem. Pilgrims who had journeyed with Him were jostling and cheering as they all began the steep climb into the city. Long ago, the prophet Zechariah had

foretold that one day the true King, the Messiah would come, not galloping on a war horse, but riding a peaceful donkey. The crowd from Jerusalem hurried down to join the new arrivals, and the whole huge procession moved forward again with cheers and shouts. 





What are we saved from?

Christians believe that when we do something wrong we displease God and this is called SIN. Sin stops us from having a relationship with God.

When we sin or do something that God doesn't like, we break our relationship with God. There is a separation from God. In other words when we do something wrong our connection to God is broken. No matter how much good afterwards we can never do enough to make up for what we have done wrong. Christians believe that because Jesus never did anything wrong he was sinless. When Jesus was on the cross he took our sins so that we could become sinless and have a relationship with God. This is why Easter is important to Christians







JESUS ON THE CROSS

There were three prisoners to be executed that day and the execution squad set to work. By nine o'clock the three crosses were lifted into position. Jesus was on the centre one.

Then the soldiers settled down to wait, gambling with dice to while away the time.

Jesus looked down at them with pity, "Forgive them, Father," he prayed, "They don't know what they are doing."

The Religious Leaders had arrived to gloat and jeer. "You saved others," they shouted mockingly, "but

One of the criminals hanging on the next cross muttered hoarsely, "Aren't you supposed to be the Messiah? Why don't you save us all?"

But the other criminal said "You be quiet! We deserve to die, but this man is innocent." Then he begged Jesus,

"When you come as King, please remember me?"



"You won't have to wait until then," Jesus replied, "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

At noon, when the sun should have been brightest, thick darkness fell. Then, at 3 o'clock Jesus called out in a loud, triumphant voice, "Finished!" Then he gave up his life and died.

Joseph of Arimathea, a wealthy citizen, asked Pilate's permission to give Jesus a proper burial. Nicodemus, a Pharisee who was a friend of Jesus, came to help. The two men quickly washed the body, wrapped it in clean grave clothes and laid it on a stone ledge in the cave tomb in Joseph's garden. They had to complete their task before nightfall and the beginning of the Sabbath, when no work was permitted, not even burying the dead!

Some of the women who had been at the crucifixion followed to see where Jesus was buried. Then, worn out with sadness and crying, they went away.







The next morning Jesus went into the Temple Courts. This should have been a quiet place, where people could come and pray and learn about God.



JESUS ON TRIAL

"This prisoner has claimed that He is God. According to our law, He deserves to die!" shouted the angry High Priest.

But only the Roman Governor, Pilate, could pass the death sentence. They must convince him that Jesus had committed crimes against the Roman Empire, worthy of death.

So, early on Friday morning, Jesus was taken in chains, to Pilate's palace.



"This man has been stirring up trouble! He tells people not to pay taxes. He says he's a king!"

Pilate began to question Jesus himself, and very quickly, he realised that Jesus was innocent.

But all the while, a mob below in the street, mustered by the Priests and Religious leaders, were chanting over and over "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!"

Pilate came out to speak to them. "But this man is innocent. He doesn't deserve to die."

The chant rose to a deafening roar "Crucify him! Crucify him! Crucify him!"

Pilate tried another way out: "It's Passover. Let me set Jesus free as part of the celebrations."

But the Religious leaders were ready with their response, "We want Barabbas! We want Barabbas!" And soon the crowd took up the cry, even though Barabbas was in prison for murder.

Pilate was at his wits' end. If the crowd rioted, he might lose his job, or worse. The Romans were not known for their kindness or mercy. He dare not release Jesus, even though he was convinced Jesus was innocent. So he washed his hands of the whole matter. "I am innocent of this man's blood." he said. And he handed Jesus over to be put to death.







THE LAST SUPPER

It was Thursday evening. The disciples had been excited about celebrating the Passover supper, but now they began to feel more serious. They could see that Jesus was very sad.

"One of you is going to betray me to my enemies," He told them.

They were horrified. "You don't mean me, Lord, do you?" they each asked in turn.

Jesus looked at Judas Iscariot with great sadness. "Be quick and get on with what you are going to do." The disciples didn't know what was going on—they assumed Judas had been given a special job by Jesus. Judas slipped from the room and went out into the dark night.


As they went on eating the meal, Jesus did something new and wonderful. He changed the traditional Jewish Passover into a supper with a special new meaning. First He took a loaf of bread and shared it among his disciples.

"All of you, eat this." He told them. "This bread represents my body which is going to be given for you all."

Thoughtfully and a little mystified, the disciples ate.

Then Jesus took a cup of wine. "Drink this—this wine represents my life blood which is going to be given for many. My blood will be the seal of God's new covenant agreement which He is going to make with people of every nation."

The disciples drank as Jesus told them.



JESUS IN THE GARDEN

Jesus and his other disciples went to a Garden after supper, just as Judas knew they would. It was a quiet garden of silver grey olive trees called Gethsemane. Jesus often escaped there to think and pray.

It was quiet when Jesus and his friends arrived. "Will you stay here and wait for me?" Jesus asked his friends. "My heart is nearly breaking with sorrow." And then Jesus went a little way away from them to pray. His friends could see that He was shaken with grief and distress.

"Please Father," he prayed, "Don't let me go through the terrible suffering that lies ahead. Rescue me from it, if that is possible. But above all I want to do what pleases you—not what I want."

Jesus was praying for a long time. When he returned to his friends—they had fallen fast asleep.

The startled disciples rubbed their sleepy eyes—they had been woken by lights and noises—the sound of people approaching. As the newcomers got closer, the disciples were horrified to see the familiar figure of their fellow disciple Judas Iscariot. He had come with Roman guards. He walked straight towards Jesus, "Hello Master!" he called out and greeted him with a kiss.

"Judas," said Jesus "Are you going to betray me with the greeting of a friend?" The armed guards rushed in and seized Jesus, as if He were a dangerous criminal. As they started to lead their unresisting prisoner away, the bewildered and terrified disciples could bear no more. Their beloved master was allowing himself to be taken prisoner. That was the end of all their hopes. In panic and despair, they took to their heels and ran.


